Edwards Air Force Base (AFB) is a United States Air Force installation in southern California, located approximately 22 miles (35 km) northeast of Lancaster and east of Rosamond. It often referred to as Edwards, California or just Edwards.

It is the home of the Air Force Test Center and is the Air Force Materiel Command center of excellence for conducting and supporting research and developmental flight test and evaluation of aerospace systems from concept to combat. It operates the U.S. Air Force Test Pilot School and is home to NASA's Armstrong Flight Research Center and considerable test activities conducted by America's commercial aerospace industry.

Open Recreation Program



Open Recreation Program provides after school activities for children ages 9 to 12. On non-school days, after school and during the summer there is limited care. Call 275-PLAY for hours.

MEMBERSHIP

Youth, ages 9 to 18, are eligible to purchase an annual membership. The annual fee is \$360 per child. Daily membership is \$5 per child.

Youth Programs (YP) provides activities and programs that improve and maintain the physical and mental well-being of youth ages 9-12.

The YP facility has a full sized gym which also serves as an indoor roller skating rink. There is a game room with billiards, foosball, air hockey, and video games. The facility also has a club room, gaming area, computer/homework room, and 7th grade room. We also have an outdoor play area, basketball court and baseball/softball fields.

Schools on Edwards

Muroc Joint Unified School District is a K-12 unified school system of approximately 2000 students, located in the Mojave Desert approximately 110 miles northeast of Los Angeles. It was founded as an elementary school in 1911, with one teacher and less than a dozen students. The school house was located at Edwards. Boron students were bussed to the air base for their education. As the area became more populated, another school was established in 1929, in Boron. The schools became a unified district in 1953, encompassing 578 square miles in Kern and San Bernardino counties.
