Once your sponsor receives orders to Edwards AFB, you have a choice of either contacting the SLO at your current base or contacting the Edwards SLO via phone, email or webpage. Once the SLO receives your children's ages and info, we will be able to provide you with local school information both on/off base. This process should help make your transition as stress free as possible.

When transitioning from one base to another, you can also contact the *Airman and Family Readiness Center*, *Relocation Program*, and *Housing Office* for information on Edwards AFB and the surrounding communities. They will provide you with a **WELCOME PACKET** and information on our **NEWCOMER's ORIENTATION**.
